PLANTING

PLANT IN A SUNNY SPOT
IN WELL DRAINED,
FERTILE SOIL.

MAKE SURE YOU DIG THE HOLE
WIDER AND 5CM DEEPER THAN
THE ROOT BALL,
AND ADD MANURE BEFORE
PLACING THE ROSE.

PRUNING

MOST ROSES SHOULD BE PRUNED
IN LATE WINTER OR EARLY
SPRING. REMOVE DEAD AND
DAMAGED STEMS, OR STEMS
WHICH ARE CROSSING EACHOTHER

DEADHEAD FADING FLOWERS IN
SUMMER TO ENCOURAGE
MORE GROWTH CUT BACK TO
THE FIRST SET OF 5 LEAVES
AT A DIAGONAL



WATERING

ALWAYS WATER AT THE BASE
OF THE PLANT TO AVOID
MILDEW
WHEN FIRST PLANTED WATER
REGULARLY
